■ Red Flags

1. Name misuse:

Impax Asset Management (sometimes shortened to Impax) is a real, UK-based sustainable investment firm.

Scammers frequently borrow or spoof the names of legitimate funds to look credible.

2. WhatsApp as a platform:

Real investment firms do not recruit or provide portfolio management via WhatsApp groups.

This is a well-documented hallmark of pig-butchering and other investment fraud scams.

3. Marketing language:

"Alliance Elite Stock Investment Group" with vague promises of building portfolios — no regulatory disclaimers, no official links, no credentials. That's typical of scam investment groups.

4. Symbols in the name:

The use of emojis and ribbon icons is often a tactic to make a group look "exclusive" or "official" but is not how real financial institutions present themselves.

Known Scam Pattern

This setup matches a very common scheme:

- Scammers create a WhatsApp group claiming affiliation with a well-known fund/firm.
- They post fake stock charts, "testimonials," or fabricated profits to lure victims.
- Eventually, members are pressured to deposit money into fraudulent trading apps or crypto wallets.
- Once the money is in, it's very hard to get back.

■ Conclusion:

This group is almost certainly a scam posing as a legitimate investment fund.

■■ Recommendation:

- Do not share personal info or send any money.
- Exit the group immediately.
